

	AUI	Soukayna Essaidi	A Tale of The Man & The Land	A Tale of The Man & The Land is a short documentary that explores the profound and emotional connection between the people of Tafraout and their homeland. Through a series of intimate conversations and personal narratives, "Afgan d Akal" explores themes of belonging and identity. Tafraout serves as both the backdrop and the protagonist of the story, reflecting the relationship between humans and the land.
	ESAV	Ines Lehaire	Abdellah	Fouzia, a devoted mother, hides a haunting childhood secret. At 8, she is sent to work for a family in Casablanca, enduring unimaginable hardships. Now, having found her voice, she confronts her past while protecting her children from the shadows that threaten to resurface.

It's a quiet but emotional call to protect children and fight against such acts of violence.
Fiction	ESAV	Charléile Chasteau	Blue Square	In a post-apocalyptic future where artificial intelligences care for wealthy individuals who have abandoned their physical forms to live within their memories, "Blue Square" tells the story of a man virtually imprisoned in a childhood memory on a tropical beach. Through the narration of an Al voice-over, we witness a world where nature has almost entirely disappeared, leaving behind only digital echoes of the past. The Al, tasked with preserving these memories, reflects on its own inability to experience the natural world, evoking a sense of loss and nostalgia.



- **Funding and Resources:** Access to funding and resources is a major concern. Filmmakers discuss strategies for securing financial support, navigating grants, and finding affordable equipment and locations.
- **Censorship and Freedom of Expression:** The balance between creative freedom and censorship is a hot topic. Filmmakers explore how to address sensitive social issues while adhering to local regulations
- **Representation and Diversity:** Ensuring diverse representation in Moroccan cinema is crucial. Discussions often focus on how to portray various social, cultural, and gender perspectives authentically
- International Collaboration: With Morocco becoming a popular filming destination, young filmmakers are interested in opportunities for international collaboration and co-productions
- **Technological Advancements:** The impact of new technologies on filmmaking, such as digital editing and special effects, is another important topic. Filmmakers share insights on how to leverage these tools to enhance their work


#### **SOFIA (2018)**
